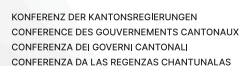
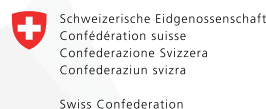
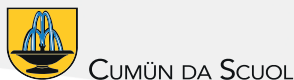
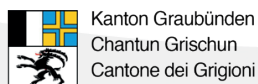
Water as a resource
